

A Lesson on The Sister, The Soldier by Susan Mcbride

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour 15 minutes Lesson Keywords: Sister Soldier

Lesson Description: This lesson is mildly difficulty reading and language arts-centered comprehensive exercise to give students practice in determining word meaning, setting, and emotions from the reading of the written text. Students are asked to give inference for basic information communicated in the text, "The Sister, The Soldier". By reading the text, students will be able to answer questions on word meaning and apply the correct meaning of the word used in other sentences. The student will write two short essays of 100 words or more to describe the setting and emotions that the author is trying to convey. They will also describe how they determined the setting and emotions from words and meaning used in the text. They will also justify their decisions for setting and emotions by stating what words and meaning from the reading helped them determine their choice.
