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# A Lesson exploring folktales using the text How the Firefly Got Its Light by Krystle Bertoncini

Grade Level: Grade 2

Subject Area: English Language Arts

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Lesson Length: 1 hour

Lesson Keywords: reading folktale firefly moon

**Lesson Description**: This lesson uses a folktale to go through word meanings, it gives the students the opportunity to evaluate the meaning of words using a passage. The goal is to help students strengthen their understanding of folktales and help them to infer information from reading.

Why do you think the moon was lonely? Do you think friends should help each other? Why is it important to build friendships?

## Task 3: Writing Activity
