

A Lesson on The Boy Who Cried Wolf! by Megan Burns

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 2 hours

Lesson Keywords: Writing, Reading, The Boy Who Cried Wolf!

Lesson Description: In this lesson the student goals are to read and write critically. Students will read a short passage and respond to vocabulary questions, that may require them to reread the text in order to obtain the meaning of the vocabulary words. Students will also be asked critically think in order to respond to short answer questions. Finally students will write in their opinion what they would do if they were the villagers. This will engage students and help them think critically. This lesson can be split into two days.

Task 3: Writing Activity
