

# A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Tristan Norby

Grade Level: Grade 3

**Subject Area**: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Fly, Moon, Critical Thinking, Reading, and Vocabulary

**Lesson Description**: The goal for this lesson is to have the students use their Critical thinking skills. The lesson is a short story about how a Firefly got its light, but though it is a short story the student have a better opportunity to use their minds on how scenes happen in the story. The students are able to discuss in small groups on how certain parts of the story happened and they are able to learn new vocabulary words.
