


A Lesson on My Job by Angelina Reina

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 2 hours

Lesson Keywords: reading, writing, vocabulary, my job, 3rd grade

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to challenge students in the 3rd grade. Students will be required to read the passage and answer vocabulary questions, discussion questions and complete a writing portion. When answering the questions, the students will need to reread the passage. Students will also learn new vocabulary words through reading and rereading the passage. After reading the passage, students will also be asked to think deeper and form their own opinion providing examples. This will engage the students, require them to maybe perform some research and have them think critically. Students will read the passage titled, "My Job". This lesson may be split into two days.

Instructions: Please read the following reading passage as many times as needed (aloud and silent) before starting to go through other lesson pages. Understanding the content of this passage is very important since the lesson activities will be all about this content. Feel free to print the passage if needed.

I didnt go to fix the problem. Thats not my job. My job is to identify a problem? and then figure out how to solve it. She told me about the problem. Then I looked at? the map on the computer. It showed that she was right. We have sensors under the? street that tell us when there is a leak. They show where it is.?
