


A Lesson on The Astronaut's Diary by Alicia Russell

Grade Level: Grade 4

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading, Vocabulary, Space, Astronauts, Comprehension, Critical Thinking, Discussion, Writing **Lesson Description**: Students will read the short story called "The Astronaut Diary". To show comprehension, they will answer questions with specific vocabulary words, followed by a class discussion of three questions, and ending with a written comparative response.

Task 2: Forum Discussion

Instructions: This discussion forum will have questions for students to respond. Read the posted questions, and respond to each. Students are responsible for posting one initial and and two peer responses for each topic.

1 - Teamwork

The astronaut states there will be more work to do, but they will work as a team. What type of work do you think needs to be done on the space ship?

2 - Disappointment

When the astronaut finds out they have to take the night shift, they state that they are very disappointed. Explain a time when you had to do something you didn't want to and?were disappointed.

3 - Astronaut

The author says, I became an astronaut so that I could travel in space. Now Im here. It is hard work. Its even more challenging than I expected. What do astronauts have to do that is hard work?
