Grade Level: Grade 3 Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading, writing, my new brother, feelings, emotion, vocabulary

Lesson Description: The goal of this activity is to give students the opportunity to practice their reading and writing skills using a passage titled "My New Brother.: Be reading and rereading the passage, students will practice using context clues to develop an understanding of key words, as well as practice using context clues to understand the feelings the narrator expresses by having a new sibling.
