
A Lesson on A Good Student by Chelsea Catarelli

Grade Level: Grade 7

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Writing, Reading, and Thinking skils through comparing and contrasting

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to help students learn reading and writing skills the have already developed on a deeper level than their daily use of them. Students will practice rereading the story and analyzing the text through answering vocabulary questions and written responses. This story will help students understand comparing and contrasting as well as time management.
