


A Lesson on The Ants and the Grasshopper by Lauren Toner

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading, Seasons, Critical Thinking, Vocabulary, Animals.

Lesson Description: This lesson will have students read the following short passage individually.

Students will gain reading comprehension and vocabulary building skills, critical thinking, and reading skills.

Then the teacher will read the short passage aloud to the class and have an open discussion.

After the class discussion, students will complete the following questions and activities on their own.

We want you to live, so we will help you now. But learn from us. Playing is a?lot of fun. But you need to work to live.?
