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# A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Mckenna Subbarao

Grade Level: Grade 3

**Subject Area**: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: reading, writing, discussion, How the firefly got its light

**Lesson Description**: The goal of this lesson is to reinforce reading and writing skills that they have been practicing with these readings students can find are relatable examples of the relationship between a moon and a fly. By reading this passage closely and multiple times, focusing on questions and discussion relating to the text, students will understand why and the reason the firefly wanted to shine. With these activities and writing about the passage, students will gain a perspective of the moon and fly relationship.
