

A Lesson on The Lion and the Spider by Viera Brady

Grade Level: Grade 4 Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: The Lion and the Spider, vocabulary, discussion, writing, moral

Lesson Description: This lesson will teach the students of the story titled The Lion and the Spider. This lesson will also teach them vocabulary, deeper thinking, and how to find the moral of a short story.
