


A Lesson on My Painting by Shayna George

Grade Level: Grade 4

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: New experiences, reading comprehension, vocabulary words

Lesson Description: This lesson was created so students can expand and practice their inference making skills through vocabulary and through written responses. Students will practice this after learning about the experience of a Russian immigrant who moved to the United States. The passage talks about life transitions and the power of helping each other.
