


A Lesson on My Job by Logan Turner

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading, Writing, My Job

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to have students read and critically engage in the text. First, students will be asked to define words shown in the text that may be new to them. Then, they will reply to a discussion post that asks questions about the content of the story. They will be required to respond to their fellow classmates as well. Lastly, they will be asked to describe two good things and two bad things about the job. This will force students to reread the article and describe what they think are the positive and negative things about the worker's job that they may like or dislike.

Lesson Content: Book/Story/Reading Passage

Instructions: Please read the following reading passage as many times as needed (aloud and silent) before starting to go through other lesson pages. Understanding the content of this passage is very important since the lesson activities will be all about this content. Feel free to print the passage if needed.

Content: I am a worker at the department of streets and sanitation. We take care of the?streets, and the sewers, too. I go to work at midnight and I work for 8 hours. It took?me a while to get used to working at night, but now Im used to it.?

Most people work during the day. They can get their job done then. Their?workplace closes at night. Thats called business hours. They dont have to be there to?take care of things. Sewer workers have to be available 24 hours a day. You cant close?our office, because someone always has to be on duty. If a sewer breaks in the middle of?the night, we have to fix it then. If we dont fix it right away, the problem will get?worse.?

One night I was on duty and there was a problem in a community. I got a call?from a homeowner, and she said that the sewer was broken. I asked her how she knew.?She said there was dirty water coming back up into their street.?

I didnt go to fix the problem. Thats not my job. My job is to identify a problem? and then figure out how to solve it. She told me about the problem. Then I looked at? the map on the computer. It showed that she was right. We have sensors under the? street that tell us when there is a leak. They show where it is.?

I sent a team to fix the?problem. Some of them were on duty. Others were off?duty. I called them at home and asked them to meet the team at her street. Task 3: Writing Activity
