#### Grade Level: Grade 5

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 1 hour 30 minutes

**Lesson Keywords**: Reading, Writing, Understanding families. Letting go of material items and recognizing family bond. **Lesson Description**: The goal of this lesson is to to encourage children to read and reread an emotional story. To find key points and read carefully. Students will see how Love is key and how sometimes family is you need.
