

A Lesson on My First Baseball Game by Elizabeth Free

Grade Level: Grade 3 Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 2 hours Lesson Keywords: Readding, vocabulary, discussion, writing.

Lesson Description: The goal for this lesson is for the students to understand and comprehend the story "My First Baseball Game." The students will then be directed into answering vocabulary questions mentioned in the story. The students will then answer comprehensive questions and be asked to write about a topic that has been provided for them. The students then will comprehend some of the terminology from the story.

2 - The boys reaction to the lost

How did the boy react and answer to his uncle to having fun at the game towards the end of the story?

3 - The purpose of the story

The author told a story about a little boys first baseball game, but what was the author trying to show us by the end of the story?

Task 3: Writing Activity

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Instructions: For your writing activity, in your opinion how did the fans of the Cubs react to them loosing the game? In 2-3 paragraphs (a minimum of 250 words) write an essay answering the question below. Give at least 2 examples from the text to support your answer.?
