A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Ali Marry

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 15 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Helping others, reflecting, reading, writing

Lesson Description: With their knowledge from the reading students will be able to identify and define words with their proper meaning. The students will also answer questions related to the text and write a short answer that best supports what they learned and shows connections. From the story students learned the importance of helping others. During the last activity students will reflect on a time someone helped them.
