


A Lesson on Community Meeting by Brittany Evers

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 1 hour

Lesson Keywords: Reading comprehension

Lesson Description: Throughout this lesson, students will read a story and answer questions pertaining to the story.

They will also be asked to respond to an essay question using deep thought about the story they just read.
