


A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Taylor Clough

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 45 minutes Lesson Keywords: Firefly Lesson

Lesson Description: A Language Arts lesson based on a firefly and his new friend the moon. The assignment includes two writing assignments and 2 questions. Each vocabulary question contains a question in which you must define the word and then use that word correctly in a sentence.

1 - The flies feelings.

Throughout the story the narrator talks about different feelings the fly feels. In 3-5 sentences compare and contrast?how he felt at the beginning of the story to the very end of the story.?

2 - The Moon and the Fly

In the story the moon explains to the fly why he is lonely. List the reasons why he is lonely and ways that the fly can help him with these reasons.

3 - The Mouse's Mother

When the mouse sees the fly begin to shine he thinks that he is special and wants to shine just like him, but the mouse's mother says that it is dangerous. Why do you think it would be dangerous for the mouse to shine? Explain in 3-5 sentences.
