

# A Lesson on The New Family by Nicole Hodock

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour 45 minutes **Lesson Keywords**: The New Family

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to allow students to practice their reading skills, writing skills and learn new vocabulary words while reading the story of the Robinsons' moving to a new neighborhood. The goal of this story is to learn about safety rules and how important they are to people and that you need to respect that.
