


A Lesson on A Good Student by Adrienne Clark

Grade Level: Grade 7

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 45 minutes

Lesson Keywords: tremendously, orientation, immensely

Lesson Description: In this activity, the students will answer several questions related to course content as discussion topics and students should respond to these questions and provide their responses. This activity if implemented well, will encourage critical reflection and knowledge construction, rather than inviting to a simple agree/disagree conversation.
