

The Atoms Family by Kyle Jarvis

Grade Level: Grade 8 Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour

Lesson Keywords: middle school, science, 8th, atoms, matter

Lesson Description: In this lesson students will understand that all matter is made of atoms. Atoms consist of protons, neutrons, and electrons; the nucleus consists of protons and neutrons, with electrons orbiting in shells. Protons have a positive charge, electrons have a negative charge, and neutrons have no charge. Changing the numbers of protons, electrons, or neutrons changes an atom and can create different elements. Elements each have different properties that are useful to people in different ways.
