


A Lesson on My Summer by Nicole Cashen

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Summer, write, vocabulary

Lesson Description: The lesson has students read a passage and respond to questions. The students will be required to reread the passage in order to answer the discussion questions. The students will acquire new vocabulary through reading and re-reading. The students will have to think critically to answer the discussion questions. After reading the passage, the students will have to write about a second summer visit to the grandmother's. This will allow students to interact with the passage and write creatively.
