


A Lesson on The Boy Who Cried Wolf! by Brooke Slawson

Grade Level: Grade 2

Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading Comprehension, Discussion, Writing assingment, The Boy Who Cried Wolf **Lesson Description**: The goal of this lesson plan is to provide students the oppurtunity to develop their reading comprehension skills. The students and I will read the passage "The Boy Who Cried Wolf". After reading the story the students will answer questions on vocaubulary words that were in the story. Students must also answer questions regarding the meaning of this story. Students will have to decide why did the villagers did not come help the boy for a third time. After written work is done, there will be a discussion on the story and its meaning.
