

A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Allie Rogers

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 2 hours

Lesson Keywords: Reading, evidence, and thoughts

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to expand the students comprehension, and writing skills based on the idea of being special. Through vocabulary, discussion, and essay questions they will recollect what the fly went through to become his idea of special. Students will be going back to the story to answer the questions leading them to learn new words, and dig deep into their own feelings and thoughts.

Instructions: Please read the following reading passage as many times as needed (aloud and silent) before starting to go through other lesson pages. Understanding the content of this passage is very important since the lesson activities will be all about this content. Feel free to print the passage if needed.

1 - Why is the fly sad

2 - Why does the moon help the fly

The moon said, Little fly.? You can help me.? If you do, I will help you.? I will make you shine. The moon did not have to help the fly, but he did. Why did he help the fly? Would you have helped the fly, and why? What would you have asked in return from the fly?

3 - What is the secret

The moon told the fly the secret.? The moon told the fly how to shine. What?do?you think the secret was??How was the fly able to shine? ?

Task 3: Writing Activity

Instructions: You are to write and post here a 300 - 500?word essay on what you think it means to be special. The fly from our story felt he was special once he was able to shine, what do you think?makes people, places, or things special and why. Use what you've learned from our story to explain in your own words what being special means to you.
