

A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light by Crystal Ficken

Grade Level: Grade 3 Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 2 hours

Lesson Keywords: Reading, writing, A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light

Lesson Description: The goal of this lesson is to give students the opportunity to use the reading and writing habits they've been practicing on a regular basis to absorb deep lessons from the story, "A Lesson on How the Firefly Got Its Light. By reading and rereading the passage closely, and focusing their reading through a series of questions and discussion about the text. When combined with writing about the passage, students will discover how much they learn from story.

Lesson Content: Book/Story/Reading Passage

Instructions: Please read the following reading passage as many times as needed (aloud and silent) before starting to go through other lesson pages. Understanding the content of this passage is very important since the lesson activities will be all about this content. Feel free to print the passage if needed.

Task 1: Forum Discussion

3 - Write a short story using the word dangerous.

Write a paragraph with a minimum of 50 words. Make sure you use context clues and descriptive words.
