

A Lesson on My New Brother by Danielle Warmke

Grade Level: Grade 5 Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 45 minutes Lesson Keywords: Brother, Reading comprehension Lesson Description: Has vocabulary and comprehension questions that the students will answer to prove they are comprehending the reading.
