A Lesson on My New Brother by Erin Rogers

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 1 hour

Lesson Keywords: My new Brother

Lesson Description: In this lesson, students will read and answer questions related to the story "My New Brother". The goal of this lesson is to provide students practice with closely reading text, and to increase the comprehension of the author's meaning by studying the characters and the events in the story. Students will be asked to answer vocabulary and text dependent questions, make inferences, and analyze the texts and it's purpose.
