## A Lesson on The First Flag by Rebecca Berry

Grade Level: Grade 3
Subject Area: English Language Arts
Lesson Length: More than 3 hours
Lesson Keywords: flag, America, Betsy Ross
Lesson Description: This lesson helps students to understand the importance and meaning behind the flag of the United States of America. This lesson tests students on vocabulary from the passage. This lesson also has students use critical thinking to answer important questions.
