


A Lesson on Penguins by Deidre Olenchalk

Grade Level: Grade 4

Subject Area: English Language Arts **Lesson Length**: 1 hour 30 minutes

Lesson Keywords: Reading, Vocabulary, Discussion, Writing

Lesson Description: Students will read a short passage about penguins. The goal of this lesson is to use their reading, writing and language skills for the three activities that relate to the passage. The students will review key vocabulary words within the text and within alternate sentences. Next, they will independently answer the Discussion Activity which will be followed by a group discussion. Finally, the students will complete a writing assignment.
