


A Lesson on My New Brother by Lauren Lopez

Grade Level: Grade 3

Subject Area: English Language Arts

Lesson Length: 1 hour

Lesson Keywords: My New Brother

Lesson Description: In this lesson, students will read the story and after answer questions from the story "My New Brother". Students will be asked questions based on vocabulary from the story events that occured and making inferences. The goal of this lesson is to help students to increase their comprehension and being able to go through text to find answers to understand the storyline.
