

A Lesson on Traveling with Lewis and Clark by Katherine Henderson

Grade Level: Grade 4 Subject Area: English Language Arts Lesson Length: 1 hour Lesson Keywords: Reading, Writing, A Lesson on Traveling with Lewis and Clark Lesson Description:

The goal of this lesson is to incorporate reading, writing and comprehension skills. Students must read the passage and be able to answer specific questions in regards to how the author viewed his personal journey with Lewis and Clark. Also what traveling was like back during that time period. They will also write a short essay about the story describing his travels and how he felt about them.
